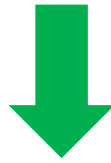


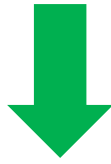
## Suspected case of COVID-19 at school



1. A child displays symptoms: Temp. over 37.8, Persistent cough or loss of taste or smell
2. Staff member to put on PPE – visor/face mask, gloves and apron
3. Notify Head teacher
4. Parent/carers will be called and asked to collect child asap.
5. Child will be taken to a separate room – old staffroom -to be isolated, they will continue to be fully supervised by the same staff member in full PPE
6. Staff member who has been with child will take them outside to meet parent/carers in PPE.
7. Parents will be directed to the ['Stay at home guidance'](#) for isolation advice for child and the whole household.
8. Family will be directed to go onto nhs111 online and use their symptom tool and will be asked to [arrange a test](#) and to share results with school.
9. PPE will be disposed of, as per guidance. Wash gloved hands in anti bac from the dispenser on the fence, take PPE off, last items are gloves and bag them. Tie the bag up and place in large bins.
10. School will notify WCC Local Outbreak Response Team and complete template to record pupil illness at school and send to WCC Public Health



### **School receives test results from family**



- Negative result: child can return to school if well and no symptoms and no raised temperature for 48 hours.
- Positive test: follow flow chart for 'Confirmed cases'.
- Void/unclear result: continue to self-isolate and arrange retesting.

### **Confirmed case of COVID-19 at school**

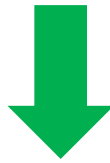


- Parents/carers to contact school asap with positive test result
- School will contact WCC Local Outbreak Response Team (LORT)
- Bubble/Class group may need to [self-isolate](#)



## Should a Bubble need to isolate:

- School will text and email parents/carers of bubble asking for children to be collected immediately
- School will consult with LORT and/or Public Health England
- Further advice will be sent home to relevant families.
- Staff within these bubbles need to prepare for the possibility of them having to go home and self-isolate for 14 days, should this be the advice from the Public Health team.



- Child with positive test result must isolate for 10 days starting on the day of receiving test result. All others in same household must isolate for 14 days.
- Bubble closed due to being in close contact of someone with a positive test children and staff must isolate for 14 days. Other members of household do not. If symptoms occur during this time a test should be arranged, if positive, a 10-day isolation must begin on the day of receiving test result.
