

Modern Foreign Languages at Rigby Hall



Intent

- To develop an understanding of another language – German.
- To learn, use and apply simple German vocabulary.
- To respond to questions in the German language with an appropriate response.
- To provide a valuable educational, social and cultural experience for pupils.
- To support an understanding of living in a multi-cultural society.
- To develop positive attitudes to other languages and cultures.
- To foster curiosity about the wider world and different cultures.
- To monitor and evaluate pupils' progress and the quality of the outcomes they achieve.
- To develop speaking and listening skills.

Implementation

At Rigby Hall we aim to implement MFL in a fun, enjoyable and meaningful way. The children will be given enriched MFL experiences each term which includes trying new foods, learning about different cultures, discovering similarities and differences and holding celebration days. We will be developing speaking and listening skills through games, role-play, action songs and symbols whilst learning some different MFL vocabulary such as greetings, numbers and names.

We provide an accessible MFL curriculum which is differentiated to suit individual needs, our lessons are practical and engaging to ensure the children are given the best opportunities to succeed in their learning.

All children have a Pupil Profile that takes into account all the possible obstacles/ barriers/ interventions that might be effecting the child's education. This profile is then reviewed on a termly basis against their progress within Modern Foreign Languages and adjusted as necessary

Impact

- Pupils progress is continuously monitored and levels of attainment will be assessed at intervals throughout each Key Stage using SOLAR (our assessment software package).
- KPIs for each Key Stage and for each pathway to ensure our pupils have the opportunity to progress.
- All students have the opportunity to work towards external qualifications.
