Children in Key Stage 2 won a Kurling competition and progressed to the Worcestershire School Games Finals in March 2016. Staff have had access to CPD on offer through the academy to improve confidence and quality of delivery. Links in to change for life programme which is running on a weekly basis focusing on basketball, has increased engagement of the students and has impacted on progress and behaviour. Teachers gain experience and ideas linked to physical activity. Coaches have supported in assessment and have planned the sessions alongside the teachers. Coach coming in to school on a daily basis to run a lunchtime sports club for Primary students.</p>	<p>Coaching has supported the staff and they feel that they have had CPD. Next year employ coaches for one lesson a week per class not two (extra class next year) to ensure staff take ownership of PE lessons.</p>
