There is a need to get school back to somewhere near where it was before the pandemic, however, as COVID-19 is still very much a part of our community, we will proceed and return with some caution.

This plan focuses on the recovery of the environment and routines, rather than the curriculum, and offers some forethought as to what we are hoping to have achieved by Christmas.

Every consideration we have made and shared will be open to review throughout this Autumn term, with changes being made as and where necessary and in line with local and government guidance. This plan will be reviewed and emailed out to Staff, Families and Governors as soon as there are changes. We thank you for your continued support, understanding and co-operation.
