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Dear Families,

### Weather

### **COVID**





Students have enjoyed starting new units in all areas of the curriculum. In vocational studies, students have been following instructions and working together in order to make apple crumble.


In ICT, students have been using a range of different applications to record information and will move onto finding information using ICT.

\We have been busy looking at careers in the local community and students have been thinking about jobs they might like to do in the future and the skills they may  $^\prime$ need in different job roles.

Students have been learning about what personal information they would need to provide for a job application and what information we shouldn't share with people we don't know.

Unfortunately, we are yet to go out and about in the community but plan to do so after half term.





# Spruce

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In Maths this half term we have been exploring the topic of time. We started by looking at how to tell the time on both analogue and digital clocks. No-one will be surprised to know everyone was a lot more confident with the digital! We also looked at seasons and calendars. It was actually really useful to take some time looking at calendars and how to use them to find information. We have also looked at real world problems with time including using journey lengths to work out whether or not people will be late!





In English this half term we have been exploring non-literary texts. This is a very fancy way of describing any text that isn't a traditional book! It includes things like leaflets, posters even photographs and looks at the skills needed to decode the information included. We will be carrying this on after half term where we will be exploring non- continuous texts. This again just means those things where the information isn't provided in one piece. They might need to navigate the page to pick out key information or use sub headings to find the part that applies to them. We have also learnt some techniques to help decode new vocabulary without having to use google or a dictionary.

In PSHE we have looked at types of employment and personal qualities. It can be really difficult to recognise strengths in ourselves so it was really nice to be able to take the time to work out what special skills that we could provide a workplace just because of who we are. For our Life Skills Challenge we have been working on an art unit based around mythical creatures. In computing we have been using different areas of Microsoft Office focussing predominantly on Excel after it became clear it was definitely the one we were least confident with. They have done really well and have even created some incredible pixel art by formatting cells.

# Willow Class

Willow class have been very busy in our mathematics lessons. We have been counting in 1s and 10s, working out missing numbers from a set of digit cards, finding missing numbers on a 100 square and even ordering a set of 2-digit numbers. We have loved working with larger numbers this half term!

Our patterns work has gone really well too, we have been looking at patterns in the environment, extending repeating patterns, creating our own repeating patterns and we have even started to explore movement patterns.







In our Literacy lessons we have enjoyed asking and answering questions. All of the children in Willow Class have enjoyed playing 'HedBanz' which has helped us to ask questions about who we are and answered questions to help our friends work out who they are. We soon moved onto the children working out who they were, what they were doing and where they were!

In PE, the children have all worked on developing their throwing and kicking skills with Emma. The children have improved their techniques as well as their aim.

We have had a great time learning about the World.

In Religious Education we have enjoyed exploring different features of the Earth such as mountains, the sea, deserts, icebergs, forests. We looked at what we could see there and what animals live there. We explored how different features of the Earth made us feel too such as penguins in the snow, fish under the sea etc.

In our Understanding the World lessons, we learnt to name our body parts including some tricky ones like ankles, wrists
 and hips. We have been comparing ourselves to others and identifying similarities and differences. We also looked at skin colour as a part of our 'Black History Month' work.





# Hazel となる。なる。 This half term our topic has been 'Heroes'. We have thought about people who are heroes in our own lives. We have enjoyed designing our own Superhero costumes and practising a running stitch to begin making our costumes out of fabric. In English we have explored the story of 'Spiderman' and created our own innovated stories, based on the story, changing parts of it. In Maths, we have explored position and direction. We have been guiding each other around, using the language of forwards, backwards, left and right. We have used the four compass points of north, south, east and west and remembered rhymes to help

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us: - "Naughty Elephants Squirt Water"

In Science, we have enjoyed exploring different materials. We have made predictions and tested our predictions to see if the results were right. We have explored absorbency and waterproof materials. We handled different materials to see which materials would bend, twist, stretch or squash.

> In RE, we have explored the Creation story, thinking about what God created on the different days and what we are grateful for. We enjoyed learning and signing Harvest songs.

Hazel Class has enjoyed our Forest school's sessions. We have acted out our Spiderman stories on the stage, we have directed each other around trees and obstacles using positional language. We have enjoyed making dens and beginning to look at the leaves changing colour for Autumn

### Rowan





This half term our topic has been 'Heroes'.

In English, we have explored the story of Spiderman and have created our own story stories based on the story of Spiderman. In lessons, we have changed parts of the story by adding our animals to the story.

In History, we have been exploring the Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell and how they were seen as Heroes during the wars.

In Forest School, Rowan class have been exploring the different materials and counting leaves and twigs. We have enjoyed creating dens and playing shops and restaurants.

In Maths, we have been learning about position and direction. We have been exploring language, forwards, backwards, left and right. We have been using compass points of North, South, East and West.







In Science, we have been learning about different materials. We have been experimenting the different absorbency of materials and testing out whether they are waterproof. We have been making some predictions before the experiments to see if our results were correct. We have also used been testing out different materials to see if they bend, twist, stretch or squash.

In RE, we have been exploring the 7 days of creation and learnt a song to help us remember each day. We have enjoyed practicing our Harvest Festival song 'Harvest Samba'.








Holly class are looking forward to a restful half term and can't wait for next term's adventures!

In Literacy, we have been learning to demonstrate the four rules of listening. We have been building up our concentration an ability to attend in small groups. We have also been building up our phonics listening skills so that we are familiar with listening for the initial sounds in words!





In maths we have been learning about patterns. We have been making and finished 2 and 3 step patterns. We have also been recognising patterns in the environment (socks, superhero capes, animal fur, etc). In number, we have been building on our number and counting knowledge. We have engaged in a range of number songs, recognising numerals and finding the missing number!

We have begun our fantastic work in communication too! Developing lots of new skills such as PECS, using ALDs to support communication and our listening skills. The children this term have enjoyed our "what's in the box?" sessions the most!







We practiced really hard for our harvest festival and did some fantastic singing and dancing for single dangle scarecrow!


Next half term, our theme will be "time to rhyme!". We will be continuing to develop all of our communication skills and looking at lots of new song and rhymes!
