Some of you struggle with your emotions at times and we understand this and want you to know we are always here to support you and let you know that we will always care for you, and we will always get the best from you, for you. Your energy, enthusiasm and 'want' to learn and soak up lots of new knowledge is wonderful to see and I want to thank you all for the being the reasons I have come in to work every day, even on the hardest days, because you all deserve that and so much more, and you are a pleasure to be around. To all of you, thank you from the bottom of my heart. I am looking forward to seeing you all grow, develop and progress even more next year!

Whole School Attendance is : 89.9%

What YOU must do:

Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.

Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.

If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.

Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.

Arrange in advance if you wish to collect your child before 3 o'clock and have received permission to do so.

If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

Check your child's attendance every day.

Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.

Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.

If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.

### Beech


## PE

In our Life Skills Challenge we learnt about going shopping, identifying products from their different logos and taking part in role play as either the customer or shop assistant.


In maths we have looked at subtracting and adding one and two digit numbers and have started to look at multiplying by 2, 5 and 10.
